


Chest X-Ray

Operating from six bases in Great Britain, the mobile and static units of X-ray Services can offer a convenient system of chest X-ray examination for new entrants, for special and for periodic surveys. For almost 20 years the Medical Service of the National Coal Board has been carrying out chest X-ray examinations of miners and other staff. In the last 10 years, well over 1 million radiographs have been taken. For geographical reasons, bases must be maintained throughout the country, but with the reduction in manpower there is now some spare capacity which can be made available to other industries.

TODAY'S DRUGS

New 1970 Edition

The problem facing the prescribing doctor today is choice. Catalogues of drugs—no matter how detailed—are of little help unless accompanied by advice on which drug to give for what condition. So this new edition of "Today's Drugs" not only gives a full account of the drugs but also includes clear accounts of the management of common conditions such as urinary infections and epilepsy.

The new edition differs from the earlier one in other ways. It deals with only three subjects—infections, vitamin deficiencies and anaemias, and disorders of the nervous system. Further volumes will be published at intervals of about a year, and by the time the whole field of therapeutics has been covered this first volume will have become obsolete and due for replacement. In order to further emphasize the ephemeral nature of books on therapeutics—and to cut costs—the book is a paperback.

Diseases of the Joints

Arthritis and rheumatism are common complaints, even if patients are often vague about the exact meaning of the terms they use. In the last few years the diagnosis of joint disorders has become more exact, while the introduction of local and systemic steroid therapy and the powerful non-steroidal anti-inflammatory drugs has revolutionized treatment. In an attempt to bring doctors up to date in this field, the *B.M.J.* published in 1969 a series of short articles giving practical advice on the common disorders of the joints. The articles have now been revised by their authors and collected together to form this handbook on the management of arthritis.


