

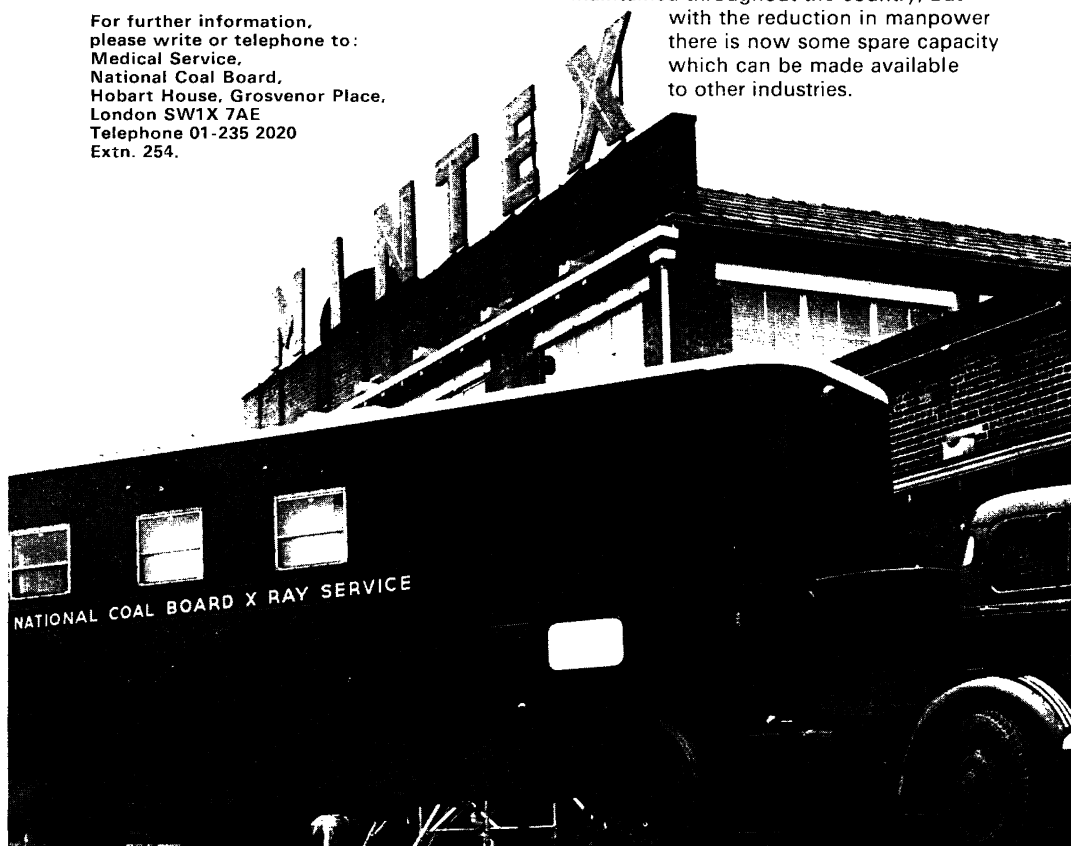

For almost 20 years the Medical Service of the National Coal Board has been carrying out chest X-ray examinations of miners and other staff. In the last 10 years, well over 1 million radiographs have been taken. For geographical reasons, bases must be maintained throughout the country, but with the reduction in manpower there is now some spare capacity which can be made available to other industries.



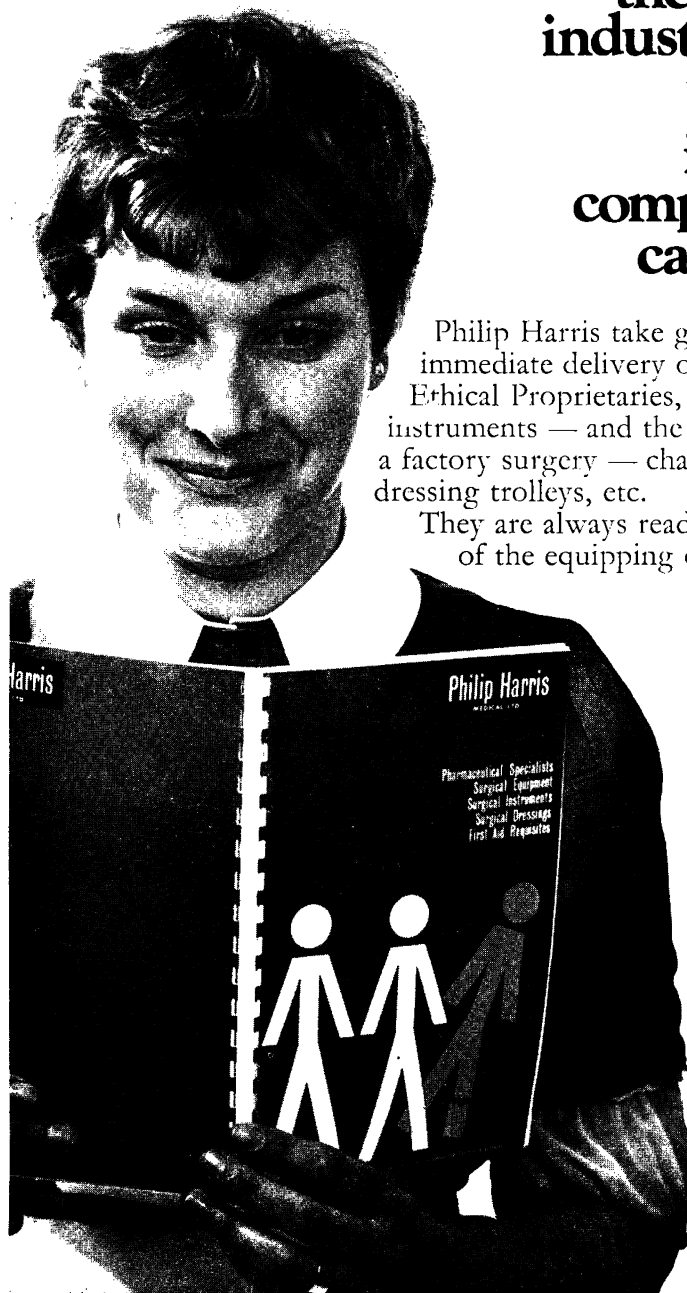

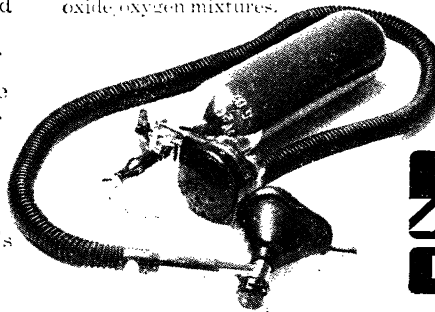

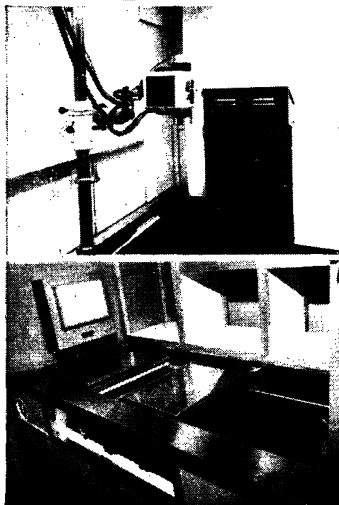

Diseases of the Joints

Arthritis and rheumatism are common complaints, even if patients are often vague about the exact meaning of the terms they use. In the last few years the diagnosis of joint disorders has become more exact, while the introduction of local and systemic steroid therapy and the powerful non-steroidal anti-inflammatory drugs has revolutionized treatment. 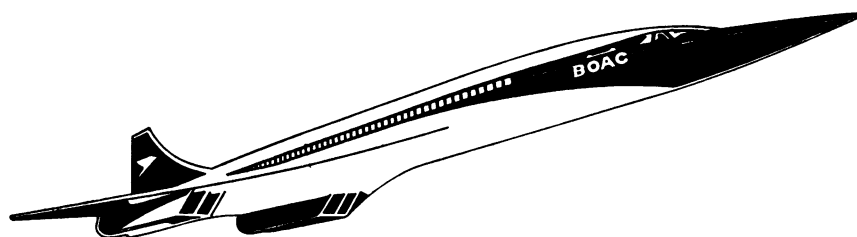
