

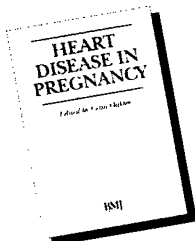

DIPLOMA IN OCCUPATIONAL HEALTH AND SAFETY

The Program in Occupational Health and Environmental Medicine at McMaster University, Hamilton, Ontario, Canada, offers two programs each year for this Diploma. A full-time program starts in September catering to those who wish to complete the course in three months. A part-time program is designed so that students, within commuting distance from Hamilton, can continue their normal employment; this program also starts in September and continues through to the end of April; basically one day per week (Wednesday) but includes two extended periods of full-time study each lasting two weeks.

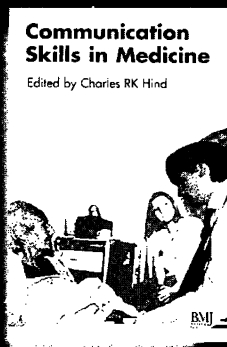
